

After Thirty Years, Discipline is Still the Focus

Dedicated Coach Stresses Fundamentals

For more than thirty years the pounding sound of a ball being dribbled, the screeching sound of tennis shoes against a hard wood gymnasium floor, and teaching kids the game of basketball has been the passion and profession of Coach Gerald Stokes. Gerald began his coaching career at the Upton Recreation Center in 1983. He moved to the John Edgar Howard and Claremont Recreation Centers before discontinuing coaching. But the love

of basketball and the desire to teach the game drew him back to coaching.

"I am a teaching coach. I believe discipline is a key to the game and discipline leads to improved skill development. I also believe it transcends the game into all aspects of a kid's life. In every practice there are four things that I consistently teach and they are free throws, lay-ups, rebounding and defense. A kid must not only be taught what to do, but how to do it and why."

Some basketball programs require kids to have a specific level of academic success before they can play. "I accept kids where they are academically," says Gerald. But I require them to improve to continue to play. Eighty percent of my players attend college. Both of my Assistant coaches, Donte Bright and Terrell Vincent, are my former players. Both of them played at the University of Massachusetts. I didn't select them as my Assistant Coaches because they were my former players. I selected them for their knowledge of the game, their communication and people skills and their love for teaching the game."

For four weeks in March 2016 Gerald conducted a House League for forty-eight 12 and under kids at the Chick Webb Recreation Center where he is employed as a Senior Recreation Leader under the leadership of Center Director Lisa Hammack. "These Kids," said Gerald, "were not highly skilled players, but they competed vigorously against players of equal ability. They enjoyed competing while learning the game." Each team received a team trophy and each player received a medal.

One of Gerald's most notable former players is Denver Nuggets shooting guard Will Barton.
